# KANKAKEE VALLEY SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

Our concert theme this year was "MUSIC BRINGS US TOGETHER". And, together, we are on the cusp of a new season building on previous successes.

Our area's traditional Fourth of July celebration was held on the banks of the Kankakee River in partnership with Kankakee Community College, the City of Kankakee and the Kankakee Valley Park District. It was a glorious evening, featuring spectacular and patriotic music by the KVYSO, the Kankakee Municipal Band and the KVSO. Tchaikovsky's Overture from 1812 introduced the fireworks! How wonderful it was to celebrate our Nation's finest holiday with our neighbors and friends.

The summer of 2021 featured KVSO quintets and quartets performing in Kankakee's Cobb Park, the Farmers' Market, St. George Church and the Railroad Depot, with no cost to our guests. These events were well received by the public and very significant to our musicians.

The regular concert season found KVSO at several venues. We are grateful to Asbury United Methodist Church for hosting our September 26th concert; to Olivet Nazarene University for hosting a memorable evening on November 10th; to Kankakee High School for our traditional holiday concert on December 5th; to Morning Star

Sunday rehearsals at Larsen Fine Arts Center, Olivet Nazarene University, began outside under the tent with Covid-19 mitigations in place.
- November 21, 2021 Fall concert at Kresge Auditorium, Larsen Fine Arts Center, Olivet Nazarene University. This concert marked the return of the full orchestra, featuring works by Leroy Anderson and Saint-Saens.
- December 5, 2021 KVYSO members were invited to play on the KVSO Holiday Concert.

## **FOUNDATION**

The Foundation funds started the year with \$770,948, as of May 2021. Each year, an amount is transferred to the operating fund of the Symphony, based on a formula designed to support the annual operating budget while maintaining the long term viability of the invested funds. Based on that formula, a total of \$20,488 was transferred from the investments to the operating funds of the Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra during the 2021-2022 season. After eleven months of activity and the transfer to operations, the invested funds were \$726,523 at the end of April 2022.

Annual gifts of any size help to support the programs that we have enjoyed in our local community.

We ask that you consider larger gifts, either during your lifetime or in your estate plan that can assure that future generations have the opportunity to enjoy the quality of performances that we have been able to provide.

Because of the foresight of those who have gone before us, we have been able to help sustain the Symphony during several difficult years.
