# 2023-2024 SEASON REPORT OF THE Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra

The 2023 – 2024 season started with the traditional and ever-popular July 4th concerts by the Kankakee Valley Youth Symphony Orchestra, the Municipal Band, our own Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra and the City of Kankakee fireworks on the beautiful campus of KCC. Huge crowds attended and good weather prevailed.

The 2023 summer series continued to expand thanks to sponsors and grants from the Community Foundation of Kankakee River Valley and the Iroquois Federal Foundation. The Music in the Park series was held at Cobb Park along the Kankakee River, Manteno and Herscher. These concerts featured the KVSO woodwind quintet, the string quartet, or the brass quintet and were available free of charge to the public so that people of all income levels, all ages and all ability levels had a chance to experience live orchestral music.

The same is true for the performances at the Rhubarb Festival, the Strawberry Jazz Festival, the Fall Arts Stroll, the Kankakee Farmers' Market, Oktoberfest and the Winter Market. The KVSO mini concerts have come to be a staple as a cultural gem in the Kankakee area.

The Kiwanis Concert in October had a record number of over 1,500 students in attendance. Held at Centennial Chapel, area fourth, fifth and sixth graders learn about the symphonic instruments, see them close-up on the large screen and listen to classical music.

The standard KVSO concert season was entitled 'Hope' with each of the concerts planned around the theme. Held at various venues, including Asbury Methodist Church, the Lincoln Cultural Center, Morning Star Baptist Church and Larsen Fine Arts Center, the musicians performed magnificently as true classical symphonic music was brought to an appreciative audience.

KVSO continues to enlist new ideas, move in new directions, use social media and engage new audience members to stay contemporary while presenting music of the greatest composers of all time.

Our successful season is possible only with our donors, concert sponsors, advertisers, concert attendees, music director, orchestra members, the Women's Guild, the Foundation, the Board of Directors and the KVYSO. Our deepest gratitude goes to all who help further the ideals of the Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra.


#### 2023

As I sit down to 'pen' this Annual Report, the sky is blue, there is a slight breeze and the temperature is a lovely 76-degrees Fahrenheit... all in all, a beautiful earlysummer day. Often, when I am composing a note to the orchestra, writing program notes, or completing some other writing task, I find myself looking out the windows of our home office in order to seek inspiration from the natural beauty outside. Today, I observe the wind rustling the leaves on the mature trees across the street and it causes me to reflect on our journey over the last 6 months. As one ponders this past season, it may feel as though the KVSO's 56th Season was an arduous one. And although that may be true, it was also a wonderful journey that revealed so many possibilities at the same time.

The journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step Lao Tzu: Tao te Ching We took that first step in January as we rebuilt the KVSO from the ground up for our February concert. Not only did we manage to recruit the musicians for a chamber orchestra but also nearly completely replaced the original repertoire for that performance. All of this was accomplished over a few weeks in January! Our first step together was a big one.

Immediately following our February concert, we set to adding to the orchestra and acquiring a soloist for our season finale in April. This, too, happened quite quickly and would not have been possible without the assistance of board members, KVSO musicians, ONU faculty and other community members who are invested in the wellbeing of the KVSO and the arts in the region. To say that this was a 'group effort' would be an incredible understatement but does clarify the importance of every person to the success of an organization such as the KVSO. Without its myriad of volunteers, staff and musicians, we would not be able to present memorable concert experiences for our audience members.

Scattered throughout the last 6 months have been lovely interactions with community members (including our Season Finale reception); attendance at the KCC Foundation's Fundraiser Dinner, the KVSO Women's Guild's 'Symphony of Style' and the KVSO Women's Guild's Annual Luncheon; meetings with key community members and KVSO supporters; and getting to know the members of the KVSO Board of Directors.



All of these have been thoroughly enjoyable experiences and wonderful opportunities to get a better-sense of both the community and the support for the KVSO.

The KVSO's *summer season* is just as filled with activity as the *regular season* with Music in the Park concerts, small group performances throughout the region and our July 4 concert at Kankakee Community College.

Our 57th Season will be an exciting one as we explore how 'Music Speaks...' (derived from Hans Christian Andersen's 'Where words fail, music speaks.') and will feature two guest artists (French pianist Matthieu Bergheau and Ohio-based violinist Andrew Sords), several collaborations with the KVSO Chorus (Debussy's 'Nocturnes' and Vivaldi's 'Gloria'), the annual Kiwanis Concert (a Halloween-inspired theme), a Baroque Christmas program featuring our own Stephanie Lupo & Clara Capriotti (flutes) and concertmistress Rebekah Cope-Evers (violin) as soloists and two all-orchestra programs featuring some of the most emotionally powerful and personal music composed - Beethoven's 'Eroica Symphony' and Sibelius' 'Symphony No. 2'.

As I conclude my thoughts on this season, I again find myself reflecting on the journey metaphor. This time, it is more specific: Spain's Camino de Santiago (the Camino Francés in this case). The Camino de Santiago is an approximately 500-mile journey that will take the average hiker 35 days to complete, costs about \$60 per day (\$2100.00 total) and requires an additional investment in hiking gear (including multiple pairs of hiking boots), transportation to/from Spain and accommodations at either end of the journey. This is no small undertaking. Neither is the day-to-day operation of a symphony orchestra. The KVSO is blessed with an abundance of committed, dedicated, skilled, enthusiastic and selfless supporters who make it all possible. Thank you to one and all for your continued support of this organization and of the musicians who ARE the KVSO.

I eagerly anticipate the next steps in our musical journey together. I can't think of better companions to have on this journey.

#### **Foundation**

Annual gifts of any size help to support the programs that the Symphony provides each year. Larger gifts, either during your life time or from your estate, can be invested in the funds that have been set aside to provide income to help assure that future generations have the opportunity to enjoy the quality of performances that we have been able to provide.

The Foundation funds started the fiscal year with \$698,800, as of May 31, 2023. Each year, an amount is transferred to the operating fund of the Symphony, based on a formula designed to support the annual operating budget while maintaining the long term viability of the invested funds. Based on that formula, a total of \$29,500 was transferred from the investments to the operating funds of the

Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra during the 2023-2024 season. The increase in the value the invested funds resulted in \$774,450 of investments as of May 31, 2024.

The Symphony, as an organization, has worked to be a good steward of the funds that have been entrusted to us by prior donors. Due to this dedication we have been able to help sustain the Symphony for many years. We encourage you to consider the Symphony when you are planning your charitable giving. Thank you to all of our donors.


