What an exciting year this was for KVSO. We started with a bang on July 2 for the Independence Day celebration. There was live music to enjoy played by the Kankakee Valley Youth Symphony Orchestra and the Kankakee Municipal Band who performed prior to KVSO. While the concert and fireworks were not on the 4th of July, the community still showed its patriotic support by attending in large numbers to listen and wave flags to the traditional marches and overtures of the symphony.

Our Music in the Park series, which is at no cost to the public continued to be strong again this year. All of the concerts were at beautiful Cobb Park along the Kankakee River. It was a pleasure to hear the strains of a woodwind quintet, a string quartet, or a brass quintet while enjoying a day at the park on a summer Sunday afternoon.

Additional mini-concerts were held at the Rhubarb Festival, the Strawberry Jazz Festival, the Farmers' Market, the Fall Arts Stroll and the St. Rose Chapel fundraiser. We really get around!

The Kiwanis Concert made a roaring comeback this year. It was held in October at Centennial Chapel, and through the generosity of the Kankakee Kiwanis, over 1,200 fourth, fifth and sixth graders were able to learn about the orchestra and hear the amazing sounds.

Where else can you get that many students excited enough about music to clap and wave their program booklets in rhythm to a live orchestra?

Our traditional series concerts were held at various venues in the area and included stirring music to coincide with this year's theme of "The Power of Music." One could feel the energy of the music in the performances. The concerts held titles of the power of mood, nature, women and music in addition to the holiday concert which is truly the beginning of the holiday season for many people in the area. It's the Symphony of Sweets dinner that tops off the event.

Our successful season is possible only with our donors, concert sponsors, advertisers, concert attendees, music director, orchestra members, the Women's Guild, the Foundation, the Board of Directors, and the KVYSO. The KVSO Women's Guild began our fiscal year in August 2022 but did not meet in person until September 2022 at the Kankakee Public Library. The Kankakee Public Library has graciously offered one of their conference rooms for our monthly meetings for the upcoming year. The guild is greatly appreciative for their hospitality.

The Women's Guild 2022-2023 program books were distributed to all members. This year the Guild welcomed seven new members to our group: Barbara Edward, Rochelle Geekie, Rocie;;a Glover, Christy Goselin, Sharon Jackson, Sharon McGuire and Peggy Strange. Lynn Ahlden, Jeanne Lindberg and Diane Siaroff also moved from associate status to active membership. What a wonderful way to start the new year.

We had an extremely busy year for events. We began our year with \$9,125.18 in our treasury and ended the year with over \$33,000. We coordinated and distributed all program materials for the Kiwanis concert; provided desserts for the KVSOA Annual Dinner; utilized our culinary skills for dinner for ten at the Warren Ouwenga home: provided ushers at all KVSOA concerts: made all the hors d'oeuvres for Carol Vallone's party; provided cookies monthly to two businesses and, of course, planned for our signature event -Symphony of Sweets.

The annual Symphony of Sweets was held on December 04, 2023 and was attended by 158 people.

Liz Madsen and Carol Vallone were cochairs of this event and the evening was spectacular, with a net profit of \$17,589.12. All members of the Guild contribute to the success of this evening but special kudos were give to the co-chairs.

The Symphony of Fashion was held on May 18th at the Kankakee Country Club and co-chaired by Dee Pinski and Karen Duchene. The event was a smashing success and was very well attended. The net profit was added to the treasury.

Our annual luncheon was held on May 23, 2023 and the 2023-2024 Guild leadership team assumed their positions. Chairman - Karen Korup Duchene, Vice-chairman - Dee Pinski, Meeting Notetaker - Vicky McBurnie and Financial Secretary - Jane Veers. Additional chairs are Symphony of Sweets - Liz Madsen and Carol Vallone and Publicity - Sharon Ouwenga.

Finally, as we all look forward to the upcoming year, it was my honor to present to the Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra on behalf of the Women's Guild a check for \$33,000, which represent the proceeds from this past year's fund-raising events and contributions. What a Wonderful Group of Women!

- September 10 Auditions for 2022-2023's season, "Beginnings and Endings," were held at Olivet Nazarene University. KVYSO was able to offer full orchestral experience. Sunday rehearsals and sectionals for the regular season were held at Larsen Fine Arts Center, Olivet Nazarene University, beginning September 11.
- November 20 Fall concert at Kresge Auditorium, Larsen Fine Arts Center, ONU. This concert featured works by Bach, Beethoven, Mozart, Verdi, and Bernstein, and was dedicated to the memory of Elaine Holtzman, longtime ardent supporter and administrative assistant for the KVYSO.
- December 4 KVYSO members were invited to play on the KVSO Holiday Concert.
- December 10 KVYSO Chamber Musicians performed a short Holiday program at the Kankakee Winter Market, 4th floor of the Kankakee Public Library.

- January 15 "Bring a Friend" Rehearsal January 22 — second semester rehearsals begin, with auditions for second semester scheduled January 22 & 29.
- April 22 Saturday—Spring concert at Kresge Auditorium, Larsen Fine Arts Center, Olivet Nazarene University. KVYSO welcomed its biggest crowd of the year as it presented a program including works by Vaughan-Williams, Stravinsky, Mussorgsky, Dvorak and Woolstenhulme, Senior Orchestra members were honored, and the Lorne Schnell Scholarships Awarded. Special Guest of Honor, Dr. Don Reddick, retiring Dean of the ONU School of Music was also honored for his unfailing support of the KVYSO since its inception in 2000.

2023 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE

FOUNDATION

With the generosity of benefactors over the years, the Foundation funds started the fiscal year with \$728,582, as of May 31, 2022. Each year, an amount is transferred to the operating fund of the Symphony, based on a formula designed to support the annual operating budget while maintaining the long term viability of the invested funds. Based on that formula, a total of \$26,378 was transferred from the investments to the operating funds of the Kankakee Valley Symphony Orchestra during the 2022-2023 season. After months of ups and downs due to the volatility in the market, the invested funds had an April 2023 balance of \$722,597 with a future outlook of a rising market.
